Dear members of the Lisieux community,

We are now into a settled routine at school and the students have responded beautifully to their daily structure. It is great to see them making friends and developing confidence. Don't be concerned if your child is still showing occasional signs of anxiety – this is not uncommon. Remember it is a whole new scene for every one of our children and individuals respond differently. The best approach is to acknowledge their feelings and recognise what they are doing well; remind them of the routines and that you will always pick them up / see them at the designated time. For example, "You're feeling a bit anxious – that's okay. We all have those feelings some times. I'm so proud of you for showing persistence and determination to get ready every day and be ready for more learning. When I pick you up this afternoon at 3:15 I'll be looking forward to hearing how you handled the day and what sort of problem-solving you did." This week in our library lesson we shared the book "In my heart- a book of feelings" by Jo Witek which included these magic words: "My heart can feel so many feelings, and yours can too! Today, my heart is proud. How does your heart feel?"

Thank you to the Prep families who were able to come along to mass at St Therese last Sunday morning. We officially welcomed the children from both Lisieux and St Therese into their school families and parish. It was a special occasion, beautifully represented by the song, "Welcome to the family" (which I always find a bit of a tear-jerker!).

This Saturday we are holding our first **2018 working bee**. Have you registered with Fiona Thompson at our school reception? We would LOVE to have an army of helpers involved, even if for just an hour or two. The working bee starts at 8am and will run until midday.
