Focus of the fortnight BRAVERY

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear members of the Lisieux community,

It's been a big year for 'firsts' and our first ever **Sports Carnival** on Tuesday at Polwarth Oval was a great success. How inspiring to see our students 'have a go' and push themselves in a range of ways to experience success. Thank you to all the parents and family members who supported this event in a range of ways. Thank you also to Mr Leigh Kentish for his overall organisation of the day, representing many weeks of planning. Congratulations to **Parrwang** House who were the overall winners on the day and a special mention to Gold Medallion winners in each class: Eddie Byrne and Mira Barton in Carmel D; Finnegan Townsend and Maeve Timms in Carmel M; Michael Ouroumis and Isabella Hall in Carmel H.

Our **Focus of the Fortnight is Bravery**, which is quite fitting, as many students dug deep to show courage in participating on Tuesday when perhaps they didn't feel very confident. Being brave is the basis for many things we want our children to learn such as kindness, compassion and empathy. It takes bravery to be kind to someone who isn't kind to you; it takes bravery to speak up when something is not right; and, it takes bravery to keep going when it would be easier to give up. As educators and parents we can support our young people to become brave by:

• Showing them that it is okay to fail or be wrong. When they are not afraid to be wrong, they are empowered to have a guess, take a risk, persist. We can model this too, by letting them see us step out of our comfort zones and handle our own setbacks with good grace.

• Taking a deep breath when they are trying but not succeeding and fighting the urge to step in. It can be hard to stand back and watch our children fail, but they often discover that failure isn't that bad and this makes way for new possibilities.

•Encouraging responsible risk taking. When we allow them to experience new things and face fears, they build capacity for courage. Handling our chickens has been one practical way in which our students have faced a challenge and experienced pride in overcoming a fear at school. Sometimes a new risk might be as simple as trying a new food or taking up a team sport.

• Celebrating acts of courage, when we see it lived out, for example by sharing a story in front of the class or making the decision to tell the truth.

• Invoking cultural heritage, for example, "You come from a long line of standing up for justice. Your grandfather..." and sharing stories about family members' display of courage

• Encouraging them to reach out and be accepting of all types of people. Brave children will step out of the boundaries of peer pressure to take relational risks such as welcoming a new student or befriending someone who is alone.

We'll be learning more about bravery over this fortnight and celebrating it when we see it at school. Join us in being Positive Detectives for bravery!








BAY BLADES
