FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear members of the Lisieux community,

The season of Lent commenced on Wednesday this week and all students in Years 1-6 attended mass at St Therese Church and were anointed with ashes on their foreheads symbolising the dust from which God made us. Lent reminds us that it is possible to create something new within ourselves.

Last Sunday at our Year 5/6 mass on Sunday, Father Linh addressed the challenges facing the Catholic Church in our current time of crisis since the lifting of the suppression order concerning Cardinal Pell's trial and our subsequent knowledge of his conviction. His words offered hope in a time of hurt, deep anger and betrayal. Father Linh reminded us of the importance for us as a faith community to reach out and support one another during this testing time. He made reference to a marble sculpture by Michelangelo inside St Peter's Basilica in Rome, which captures the maternal agony of Mary, holding her lifeless son, and highlights her sense of emptiness and pain. At times of the worst suffering in our lives, we can often ask "What does this mean?" and "Where to from here?" We know that there are many whose faith and sense of trust has been rocked by recent events, and this is understandable. We also know that from Mary's deepest loss and pain came the Resurrection, and new hope. Father Linh urged us to hold on to the deep sense of who we are: the living Church; and for us to band together to allow goodness and hope for a new tomorrow to prevail. It is certainly time for us as the living Church to look towards a more authentic way of being, to support those who are hurting and grieving, and to proactively reshape the future. Perhaps for some, Lent offers a time for the beginning of this new creation. Our prayers are with those victims of abuse and their families.
