SCHOOL INFORMATION

NAPLAN

NAPLAN (National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy) tests will be held from 14-16 May for students in Years 3 and 5. These tests have been designed to provide data about student learning in areas such as reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy. These are skills that are developed over time through the school curriculum and every day in the classroom. The tests provide a **snapshot in time** of students' learning progress in these areas. The testing process should not be a reason for stress, as the results provide one of many forms of data, and can help identify specific learning needs and inform teaching programs. It is important to reinforce that NAPLAN does not provide a full picture of your child's learning. Your child's teachers have many sources of evidence to give you a complete picture of their growth. As parents and educators, we are very aware that every student is exceptional in their own right, possesses their own individual character strengths, and that the NAPLAN feedback is in no way a reflection of who they are or who they will grow to be. If any parent would like to discuss NAPLAN in more detail, please feel free to contact respective teachers.


