

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear members of the Lisieux community,

This week is National Reconciliation Week, a nation-wide focus on fostering positive race relations grounded in a foundation of truth. It is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. Our students have been engaging in a range of activities this week to help create an understanding of the need for reconciliation and respectful relationships. I hope some family members may be able to join us at our **assembly on Friday**, in which reconciliation will be the theme. The assembly will be led by our Year 1 students and will commence at 2:30pm.

At this time of the year, staff are engaged in the process of preparing formal reports about student progress and achievement. This involves careful consideration of evidence of learning throughout the first half of the academic year. To enable time for staff to participate in this process, and to continue with their professional planning of an engaging and authentic curriculum, **Friday 7 June will be a student free day**. The following **Tuesday 12 June** will be a full day of professional development for staff on the topic of Restorative Practice. This means that Lisieux families will have an extended long weekend. **Please ensure you have these dates noted in your diary.**

Of course, the school report is only one means of communicating about student progress, and there are opportunities for this to occur in many ways throughout the year. An area that we have identified for further staff priority is Formative Assessment. While Summative Assessment provides information *about* learning, Formative Assessment focuses on assessment *for* learning. Formative Assessment provides an opportunity for teachers to check for student understanding along the way and guide their professional decision making about future instruction; it also provides feedback to students so they can improve their performance. Formative Assessment helps teachers differentiate instruction and thereby improve student achievement.

In talking to your child about this process, you might ask them about shared learning targets and criteria for success. It is likely, for example, that learning targets would be discussed and displayed in the classroom, good examples of work would be shared and some form of self or peer assessment of learning goals would be occurring.

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Hand in hand with all forms of assessment, ongoing collaboration and the development of a working partnership between staff, students and parents is so important. This allows us to work together to enhance student strengths and identify areas that require additional support. Research indicates that family involvement in schools increases student achievement. The benefits of building this connection include higher test grades, better attendance, increased positive attitudes and behaviour and improved retention rates in school. Importantly, in building and maintaining this connection between home and school, our students have greater opportunity for meaningful, engaging learning experiences. We do encourage families to be actively involved in the life of our learning community and to maintain contact with staff in whatever ways are possible. Of course, all families should by now have accessed SeeSaw to see examples of your child's learning in 'real time' and our social media accounts also provide regular snapshots of what is taking place at Lisieux. REMINDER

As we are in the thick of the cold/flu season, parents are reminded that if children are unwell, they should be kept at home until well. This will minimise the spread of infection.

We have had a small number of students bringing medications to school. Please advise Fiona Thompson directly if your child is on medication- she will ensure the medication is carefully stored and administered. Please do not allow medications to be carried or administered by children.

A reminder also that as a nut-free school, students should not be bringing drinks other than water in their water bottles. Juice boxes, etc are not permitted at Lisieux. We are a nut-aware school and ask that students do not bring nuts of any kind or nut products to school due to the high number of students with allergies.
