

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear members of the Lisieux community,

Bonjour!

Currently, I am in the process of interviewing prospective Prep students and their parents for the 2020 school year. It is a time-consuming but very rewarding task. I get to hear about why families have chosen to apply to Lisieux and what parents most deeply want for their child's education. The current situation in Torquay offers great options for primary education; there is a smorgasbord of different schools on offer. What I hear back from families is that they value our focus on wellbeing, our dedication to outdoor learning, our class structure, the caring relationships which underpin our learning community and most significantly (because all good schools should be able to offer these listed things) families who are choosing Lisieux are consciously choosing a faith-based education. This will always be our point of difference and is our key mission. It's why we are here.

This term, all our members of staff, in teams of 3 or 4, have had the opportunity to visit a primary school and to observe its practices. It has been the most extraordinary professional development exercise as we have observed schools which have turned around enrolment or learning outcome trends; repurposed spaces; re-imagined the way the school day works; integrated sustainable practices, and so on. We are very grateful to the following schools for their generosity and openness: Christ the King, Newcomb; Wooranna Park Primary; St John's, Footscray; and, St James, Sebastopol. Our task now as a staff team is to take the observations we have gathered, combined with our learning from Restorative Practices training and the data gathered from our first Lisieux Community Survey, and identify some key priorities going forward. Two of those first goals are to:

- Represent graphically 'who we are' and 'what we stand for' as a Torquay Catholic primary school;
- Re-write our Respectful Relationships Policy to more accurately reflect our school values and practices.

As we determine further priorities, I look forward to sharing these with you, and as always, to working in partnership with our families to keep our mission clear, alive and authentic.

UNIFORM POLICY

Purpose

At Lisieux Catholic Primary School, students wear a compulsory student uniform with a sense of pride in belonging to the school community. The student uniform promotes equity and equality, self-discipline and care. While at school and in the community, students represent the values of the School by proudly wearing the uniform, reflecting the high standard of behaviour required of a Lisieux Catholic Primary School student.

This document sets out the circumstances and manner in which the student uniform is to be worn.

Policy

1. Full student uniform must always be worn at all times during the school day, and to and from the School, and during official School activities, unless advised otherwise by the Principal or Principal Delegate.
2. The full student uniform (Winter, Summer or Physical Education) is set out in the attached schedule.
3. Whenever the student uniform is worn, students should consider themselves to be ambassadors for the School, whether at an official event or not.
4. The Lisieux Catholic Primary School community strives to ensure all families have access to all compulsory uniform items.
5. For students with hair longer than shoulder length, hair must be neatly tied back for health and safety reasons.

Procedure

1. All Lisieux uniform items can be purchased from Bellarine Uniforms, 63 Myers Street, Geelong.
2. The uniform is to be worn in full, not mixing seasons together or wearing part of the uniform.
3. The uniform is to be worn neatly, kept clean and tidy, and be respected as an extension of the School's reputation within the community.
4. All items of clothing are the responsibility of the student. The School takes no responsibility for lost or damaged items.

TRAFFIC CHANGES DURING CONSTRUCTION OF SOUTH BEACH ROAD ROUNDABOUT

As part of *Towards Zero*, the Victorian Government's commitment to improve road safety, we're building a roundabout at the intersection of Surfcoast Highway, Messmate Road and South Beach Road.

The new two lane roundabout will make it easier and safer to access Surfcoast Highway, and in a Victorian first, include lane separators on the approach, to improve safety for drivers and cyclists.

Major construction is starting

Construction of the roundabout will start on Monday 24 June and be completed by early December. During construction, we will have the following detours and changed conditions in place.

Messmate Road

- To operate safely, we need to close Messmate Road at Surfcoast Highway from 24 June until early December.
- Marked detours will be in place to direct drivers to use Coombes Road to access Surfcoast Hwy.

South Beach Road

- To continue safe and efficient construction, we need to close South Beach Road at Surfcoast Highway from Monday 22 July until early December.
- South Beach Road will remain open to local traffic. All other drivers will be directed north onto Horseshoe Bend Road or west onto Blackgate Road.

Surfcoast Highway

- In early September, construction will be focussed on the Surfcoast Highway.
- Surfcoast Highway will remain open throughout works.
- Speeds will be reduced to 60km/h and lane closures in through the construction zone.
- We'll provide more details of traffic changes before the start of these works in September.

Plan ahead

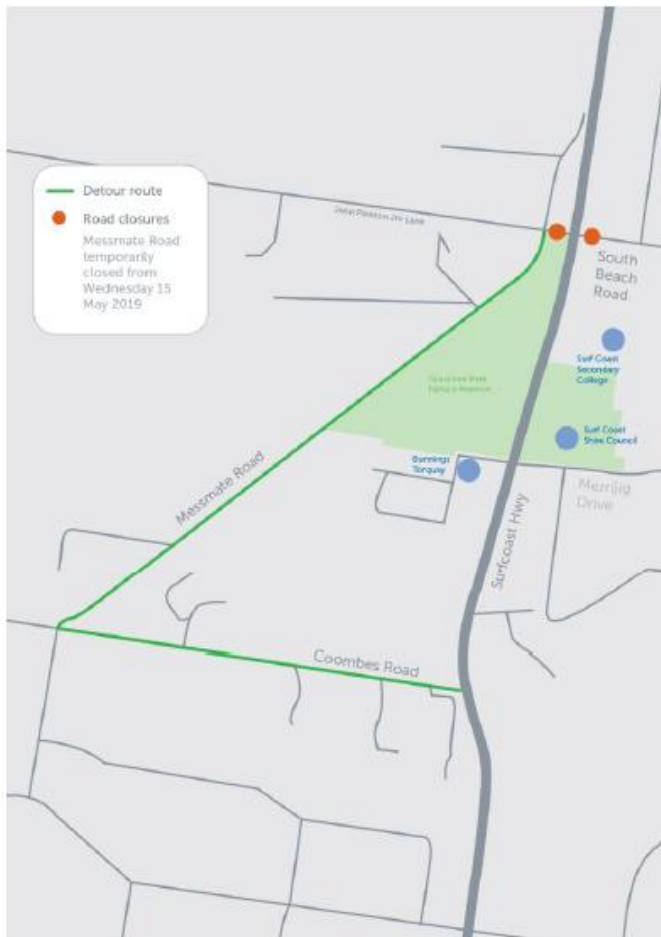
During construction we will make every effort to minimise disruption to traffic.

We ask that you keep an eye out for changes to traffic conditions, plan ahead, and allow up to 10 minutes extra travel time.

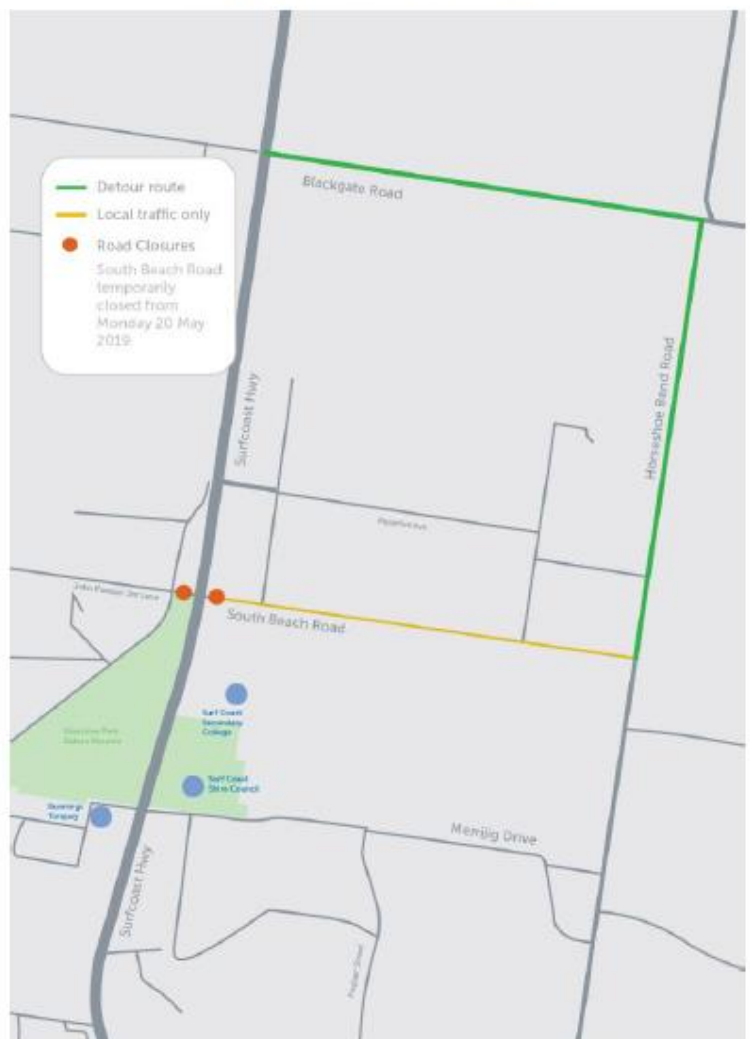
