FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear members of the Lisieux community,

In a recent edition of *The Tide*, I outlined and explained the reasons for our class configurations for 2020. As a growing school, we are in a fortunate position of having more than one single cohort in some year levels. This benefits our students as there are more children to play and learn with, and more opportunities to foster social skills by mixing with an expanded network of peers. Currently, our educators are working on the best placement of students for the 2020 school year. They are committed to ensuring that each class is balanced and that every student is teamed with both some familiar friends, and with some students who may be wonderful potential co-learners and friends. I ask parents to trust in the process as our teachers are best placed to determine the needs of all children. With this in mind, if parents have a specific need relating to class allocation, or something they feel we may not be aware of in relation to student placement, they should email me directly no later than Thursday 28 November. After this date, requests will not be able to be considered and class lists for 2020 will be finalised. I am very pleased that we will have all our 2020 educators with us on 10 December and all students will have the chance to meet both their 2020 teacher and classmates on this morning.

Tomorrow, all our current educators and some of our newly appointed staff, will have the opportunity to engage in some deep curriculum planning for next year. To facilitate this, we will have a number of casual relief teachers covering some classes throughout the day. This advance planning will enable our learning community to have some clear learning themes and objectives identified before the commencement of the new school year.

With just over three weeks of our school year remaining, there are some special events coming up. In particular, our staff would like the opportunity to thank parents and family members who have volunteered in one capacity or another and we look forward to hosting you for our Appreciation Supper on Thursday 5 December. We do require numbers by next week or will regrettably have to cancel the event. Please let Fiona in Reception know if you can make it.

2020 SCHOOL FEES

In planning for 2020 we have carefully reviewed the school's requirements together with recommended fee and levies for 2020 from Catholic Education, Melbourne. Taking into consideration our school's socio-economic status and the needs of our community, it has been decided to increase the Family Fee from \$1785 to \$1875 and the Capital Fee from \$58 per family to \$60. The Curriculum Levy for each student in 2020 will increase from \$330 to \$360, which will include the provision of technology devices throughout the school. These fee rises are consistent with the Consumer Price Index (CPI).

The new 2020 fee structure includes:

Family Fees:

Family Tuition Fee: \$1875 per annum per family.

Capital Fee: \$60 per annum per family.

Student Fees:

Student Curriculum Levy (includes all student's stationery needs, information technology provision, excursions, incursions and guest speakers) \$360

Camp Fee (Year 3/4) \$350 Camp Fee (Year 5/6) \$650

Families will be required to nominate one of two payment arrangements:

- 1) A regular nominated Direct Debit arrangement either via Credit Card or Bank Account;
- 2) Payment in full of your annual fee/levy account by the end of February, which will attract a discount of \$150.

PARISH CONTRIBUTION 2020

Parish Contribution: \$175 per family (This contribution is paid to directly to the Nazareth Parish.)

By enrolling at Nazareth Catholic Primary School you become part of our Parish community and are asked to financially contribute to the Catholic educational mission and pastoral work of our community through the payment of the annual Parish Contribution.

Please note that families who contribute to the "Parish Stewardship" program are exempt from this contribution.


