

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome to the 2020 school year, a year that promises to be full of opportunity for us as we grow and develop further. It was wonderful to welcome 196 new and returning students on Monday and to witness their enthusiasm for the new year. We also welcomed 7 new members of staff as follows:

I know you will join me in making our new community members feel very welcome at Lisieux.

On Tuesday our portables arrived and are now being set up in their new space adjoining The Field. While not new, they are spacious, airconditioned and have a great outlook through generous sized windows. Senior students will participate in an Arts project based on street graffiti and will be involved in the external decoration of a key wall. We are confident that these spaces will provide suitable short-term accommodation for our growing needs, while at the same time planning for Stage 2 building works continues very positively.

Please note that we have modified the **break times** this year, the reason being that we want to maximise the learning potential of the morning block when children are often most focused. We believe that the literacy block is the cornerstone of the daily timetable and we strive to protect it as uninterrupted instructional time. The recess break will be slightly later this year (11:20-11:50am) and the lunch break will be between 1:00-1:50pm. This gives us four evenly timed learning blocks of 80 minutes. Because of the change in times, you may wish to provide a more substantial snack for your child to eat at the first break.

This year we are introducing a new curriculum initiative we have named **Friday Flow**. Our goal in doing so is to continue to develop a learning culture that values diversity and fosters creativity, curiosity, persistence and passion. "Flow" is an optimal psychological state that we experience when engaged in an activity that is appropriately challenging to one's skill level, and results in concentrated focus on a task, deep learning and high levels of personal and work satisfaction. Students from Years 1-6 will elect one of a range of creative offerings and will work with a mentor (educator or volunteer) in mixed-age groups for a period of four weeks on Friday afternoons.

SCHOOL INFORMATION

FEE PAYMENT 2020

In accepting your child's place at Lisieux, you are required to nominate one of two fee/levy arrangements:

- 1) A regular nominated Direct Debit arrangement either via Credit Card or Bank Account;
Monthly deductions will begin 20th February 2020
Fortnightly deductions will begin 20th February 2020
- 2) Payment in full of your annual fee/levy account by end of February, which will attract a discount of \$150.
Will be taken out on the 26th February 2020

If you have not already returned your payment option please do so by no later than Thursday 13th February (a new form is required every year).

Family Fees:

Family Tuition Fee: \$1875 per annum per family.

Capital Fee: \$60 per annum per family.

Student Fees:

Student Curriculum Levy (includes all student's stationery needs, information technology provision, excursions, incursions and guest speakers) \$360

Swimming / Surf Education Program \$100

Camp Fee (Year 3/4) \$350

Camp Fee (Year 5/6) \$650

CSEF

Parents are eligible to apply for CSEF (Camp, Sports & Excursion Fund) if they hold a valid Healthcare card (HCC) or Pensioners Concession card (PCC) as of the 28th January 2020. Please collect an application form from reception.

STUDENT ALLERGIES

Parents are reminded that we have a number of students at Lisieux with serious allergies to nuts and seafood. We ask that you do not send items with nut products to school (Peanut butter, muesli bars, etc) or seafood (tuna).

KISS & DROP ZONE

Parents are reminded that the "Kiss and Drop" zone at the front of the school is strictly for pick up and drop off of students and is a no standing area. When collecting your child after school, do not park in this zone unless your child is physically standing in this area awaiting collection. Please either park in one of the designated parking bays or complete an additional lap of the car park until your child is standing at the pick up spot.
