I'd like to thank every member of our community for the way they have approached home-learning. The positive feedback and general sense of teamwork has been outstanding. 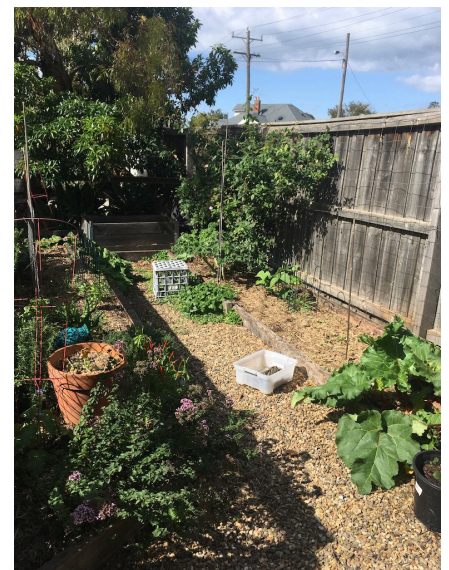
