

# FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear members of the Lisieux community,

We welcome you back to Term 3, fully aware that the weeks ahead present some unknown challenges but confident that together we are ready to respond as required. It is great to have the smiling faces and happy chatter of our students back at school and it certainly seems that students are thrilled to be back amongst friends too.

Over the break, quite a bit of action continued on our site. I hope you have had an opportunity to view our beautiful mosaic entrance boards. It was a pleasure to work with artist, Paula Retlein, on these designs, which creatively depict who we are as a community, including our key values. As previously advised, a recent tree report indicated that a number of our trees on site were dangerous and these were removed over the holidays. They have left some bare spaces so we will be engaging in a planting project with students, over the coming weeks. We are in the process of choosing some suitable bird-attracting native species. A fence was also constructed around three of the site boundaries. This afternoon, tenders for our Stage 2 building works close and myself and James Flint will be involved with other key representatives in confirming the successful company to commence works at Lisieux. I look forward to communicating the final outcome of this process to you next week.

Next Wednesday, as you would note on our Lisieux calendar, we have scheduled Learning Conferences, an opportunity for parents, students and teachers to discuss the Term 2 report, and take part in a conversation about your child's learning goals, individual growth as a learner and current classroom themes. **This year the learning conferences will be conducted remotely.** An email about the process and how to book a timeslot has been sent to all families.
