Dear members of the Lisieux community,

I am very pleased and excited to announce that Rendine Construction Pty Ltd has been awarded the contract for the works associated with Stage Two Building at Lisieux, due to commence before the end of this term. The images below provide some detail of what we can expect: 8 additional classrooms, a STEAM centre we have named The Seed Pod, a community learning space (potentially 'The Idea Lab') and an oval. The new works have been designed to maintain the integrity and general feel of Stage One. I would like to thank parents Hannah Robertson and Raphael Siket, along with staff members James Flint and Tess Righetti for their role in working with Minx Architects to bring this design to life. I look forward to sharing updates of this building phase with you.

We have been working closely with Coastal Outdoor Construction over recent weeks to upgrade our outdoor play spaces on the southern side of our site. The works are now almost completed and will increase student play space significantly. We have continued our commitment to nature-based play equipment which gives students opportunity to create, imagine and play flexibly. I am sure they will be delighted when they return to school. In Term 4, we will begin a tree planting program with every child having the opportunity to 'purchase' their own tree and be involved in planting and caring for its growth.

This Sunday is Fathers' Day and normally we would offer a lovely hot breakfast to our Lisieux dads and special male role models, as our way of saying, 'We think you are great'. 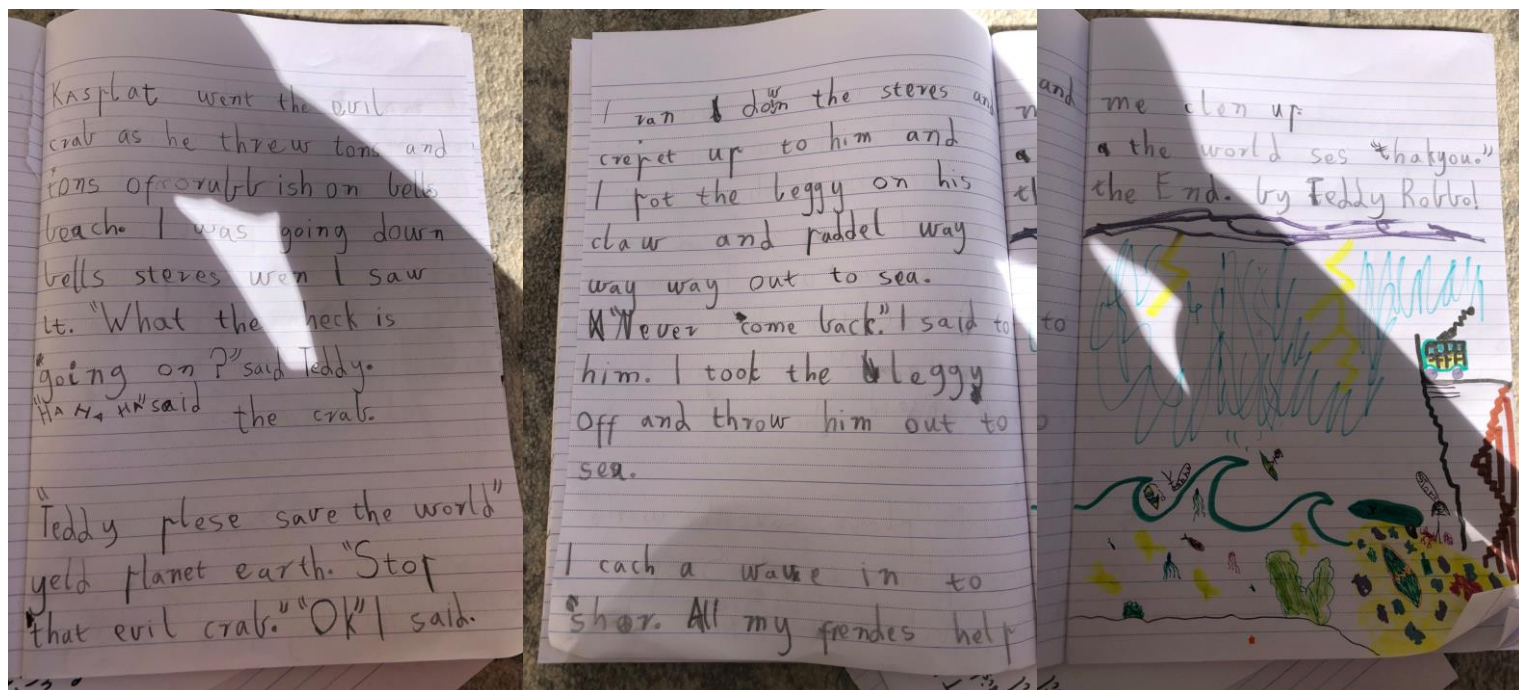
