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

GATHERING / PRAYER AT LISIEUX

Every morning at Lisieux we begin our day with gathering and prayer. Generally, students will sit in a circle, often around a prayer mat they have co-constructed (see example below from 1 / 2 Acacia Bleu). Gathering is a means to 'check in' on students' wellbeing, greet the day together and then as a class, a candle is lit, and a prayer is shared. In most classes, children will rotate responsibility for lighting the candle, putting out the prayer mat, and reading a prayer. Students may also offer their own prayer intention. Our Lisieux students are learning both traditional and modern prayers, and we have begun work towards writing our own school prayer.
