TO NOTE/REMINDERS

Please note that due to the recent change to COVID regulations, parents/ carers may now park and walk in to collect children at the conclusion of the day if this is your preference. The meeting space is the grass area behind main building. To conform with regulations, we ask that parents arrive no earlier than 3:10pm and do not linger on grounds for more than 15 minutes. POSITIVE EDUCATION

Parents often share with us the experience of asking "How was your day?" and being met with a one-word answer or grunt. Children often need 'wind-down time' when they are picked up or first walk in the door after a day at school. They need time to process the day, re-energise and nourish their bodies. Open ended questions or specific questions, such as the suggested prompts below, are great conversation starters, and many families find dinner time an ideal opportunity to try out some of these. These examples come from an abbreviated list of 50 questions. We particularly love the one, "Tell me about an example of kindness you saw today" which encourages students to consider the strengths of others, and develop empathy and emotional literacy. Try them and let us know how you go!

50 QUESTIONS TO ASK YOUR KIDS AFTER SCHOOL INSTEAD OF "HOW WAS YOUR DAY?"

- What made you smile today?
- Can you tell me an example of kindness you saw/showed?
- What did you do that was creative?
- Who did you sit with at lunch?
- Was anyone in your class gone today?
- Tell me something you know today that you didn't know yesterday.
- Did you like your lunch?
- What was the hardest rule to follow today?
- If you could change one thing about your day, what would it be?
- What made your teacher smile? What made her frown?
- If you could switch seats with anyone in class, who would it be? And why?
- What kind of person were you today?




Dear Parents and Carers,

Reconciliation Eucharist Confirmation Sacrament registration for 2021

If your child is due to complete a Sacrament this year we are asking families to register their child directly to the parish via the registration form linked below.

Please enrol your child into the Sacrament program for 2021;
If your child is in grade 3 they will be doing Reconciliation in term 2
If your child is in grade 4 they will be doing Reconciliation in term 2 and then First Eucharist in term 3
If your child is in grade 5 they will be doing First Eucharist in term 3
If you child is in grade 6 they will be doing Confirmation in term 4

You need only fill in the form once per child for which ever sacrament they are due to complete next. We will then automatically roll their information over into the following Sacrament.

Reconciliation enrolments need to be in by March 12th.

Dear Families.

Welcome back to another school year. Hopefully your holidays spent with loved ones were relaxing and filled with joy. This year we are fortunate to celebrate our faith as a community, in particular the Sacraments.

Sacraments are celebrated in the following years:

Reconciliation - Year 3 Eucharist - Year 4 Confirmation - Year 6

Last year, due to COVID restrictions, sacraments were unable to be celebrated. As a result, this year, all Reconciliation and Eucharist 2020 sacramental candidates will celebrate with the 2021 sacramental candidates.

Currently, the Sacramental Program consists of a Rite of Enrolment Mass, Family Evening (Retreat Day for Confirmation) and the sacrament celebration Mass, all of which candidates are expected to participate.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be the first sacrament to be celebrated this year in Term Two. A further notice concerning the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available soon. The sacrament of Eucharist will be celebrated in Term 3 and Confirmation in Term 4. Information regarding these two sacraments will be sent out at a later stage.

Important Dates to remember:

Reconciliation Tuesday 22nd June Eucharist Sunday 12th September Confirmation Tuesday 23rd November

Parents/Carers will need to register their children online at https://tagparish.com.au/Sacraments/Sacramental-Registration if they wish their child to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Eucharist or Confirmation in 2021. When filling in the registration form, please ensure you have all previous sacrament certificates with you.

Children who have not received the Sacrament of Baptism will need to contact the Parish Office on 9412 8444 before receiving any other sacraments.


