### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear members of the Lisieux community,

In a recent Planet Ark research study (2017) it was found that nearly 30% of teachers spend <u>no class time outside</u> while another 30% spend <u>less than 15</u> <u>minutes outside every week</u>. That's quite a confronting finding. I wonder what it tells us about the current climate of education. How does it align with what we know about young people's psychological wellbeing and the benefits of being surrounded by nature? Add to that finding that we now live in a world where the allure of indoor activities such as computer games and the internet has impacted considerably on outdoor leisure time, and that even many extra-curricular activities that young people engage in - such as dance, swimming, soccer, and so on -may actually take place indoors. What that means is that we have a world where children's opportunities for direct and spontaneous contact with nature are greatly reduced.

If you haven't registered to attend our Parent Evening Workship on Outdoor Learning, you have a couple of days left to register, and we'd love you to come and be part of this bigger discussion. Attendees will be welcomed with a glass of wine and then we'll share some research and anecdotal data about why we so passionately believe in a connection between nature-based learning and academic, social, physical and spiritual development at Lisieux. Both myself and Niki Buchan (international education consultant) will be presenting and Ron Dando, our Stewardship Innovation Leader, will be leading some activities which will encourage parents to see first-hand the approach we take at Lisieux. We want to change our school habits. These are some great tips.


- 1) Switch the lights on sensors.

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
