Dear members of the Lisieux community,

Due to the recent lockdown, some of the activities we had planned for Reconciliation Week and National Sorry Day could not proceed, however, students were involved in activities and dialogue upon their return to school last week. Reconciliation Week provides an opportunity to acknowledge and celebrate the First Nations people who have nurtured the living environment with such care. It also creates an opportunity for us to walk purposefully towards reconciliation – not simply saying sorry for past deeds, but actively and courageously addressing issues of inequality, racism and past hurt with a spirit of justice and compassion. We are noticing more people speaking up, asking questions and challenging past practices, sharing information and being open to creating a better future. This year the theme for Reconciliation Week was <u>More than a Word:</u> <u>Reconciliation Takes Action</u>, urging us all towards more courageous and bold action. This is the future we want our children to be part of – one that values equity and social justice, an environment where individuals are not afraid to stand up and use their voices for the creation of a better world.

Unfortunately, some calendared events including our planned Sports Carnival, Year 3/4 and 5/6 Beach Discovery days and Friday Flow Expo where we hoped to welcome parents to view our learning, have been postponed or modified. The Expo will proceed for students, however, visitors are unable to join us this time. Our Rainbow Day will proceed tomorrow, and we are looking forward to wearing bright colours and to raising money for The Very Special Kids Foundation, in honour of past student, Estella. A Rainbow Prayer

A rainbow is a symbol of hope and promise, a reminder that 'sunshine will return after the rain'. We especially remember our friend, Estella, when we think of the rainbow – her love of colour and her bright personality.

We can also use the colours of the rainbow to help us think about and pray for others:

Red is the colour of bravery: pray for or think about those people who are having to be brave at the moment.

Orange is the colour of waiting: pray or think about having to be patient and wait for things to get back to normal.

Yellow is the colour of sunshine: be thankful for some good things in your life.

Green is the colour of growth: pray or think about the people who are growing and producing our food.

Blue is a peaceful colour: pray for or think about people who are anxious at this time, that they will find peace

Indigo is powerful and dignified: pray for or think about those who are dedicated to make the world a better place.

Violet is a royal colour, the colour of leaders: pray for or think about the people in our government, that they will make wise decisions



STUDENT LEARNING & ACHIEVEMENTS

This year our school has prioritised our focus on spelling. Each day students start the 'literacy block' with an explicit focus on areas of need with regard to their own spelling. We use the Soundwaves framework to assess and determine these individual areas of need, and then in small groups they engage in a range of activities for approximately 30 minutes to develop their skills and knowledge in each of these areas. In their weekly planning, teachers reflect on the impact of their teaching and the growth of each student. Throughout the year, the groups change as different needs and foci change.

Student feedback:

Louie (Year 3): "It's really good because we get to switch groups and work with different students."

Laura (Year 4): "It's good because we get to learn all of the different sounds of letter combinations, and we get to play fun spelling games."

From the website: "Sound Waves uses synthetic phonics to explicitly and systematically teach students how sounds (phonemes) are represented by letter/s (graphemes) to form written words. Instruction is intentionally pre-planned so that students progress from learning simple, broadly applicable phoneme-grapheme relationships to those that are more complex and unusual. Successful spelling also relies on an understanding that words can be constructed from meaningful parts. Sound Waves gets students excited about word study across all year levels through progressive activities that explore morphology (prefixes, suffixes and Greek and Latin roots), and language concepts like homophones and homographs. Upper primary students delve deeper into etymology (word origins), helping them to understand and remember unusual or difficult words."

Dear Families,

With lockdown restrictions easing for regional areas we are fortunate to return to some familiar events on our liturgical calendar.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation celebration will continue as planned on Tuesday 15th June and Wednesday 16th June however, there will be some minor adjustments to ensure the guidelines of 50 people at a religious gathering in our parish are met. As a result, the three initial scheduled sessions will be divided into six 30 minute sessions.

Families who have already booked will now be placed into a new session time. For instance, a candidate who has booked for 4:30pm will now be placed in either the 4:30pm or 5:00pm session. The Parish Office will notify candidates directly which session they will be attending for the celebration Reconciliation. Sessions will begin on time so please ensure that you arrive on time to help minimise large gatherings and intermingling of groups.

As we all are doing our utmost best during these changeable times, families are reminded that Reconciliation celebrations are for the candidate and one parent/guardian only and will be counted on their arrival to ensure we are not over the limit. Current regulations also require that masks are to be worn and participants will need to complete the QR code process upon entry.

To assist with preparation, Fr. Linh will visit each school prior to the evening and discuss this process with the candidates.

A reminder to any families that trybooking registration is now closed and you will need to contact the Parish Office on 9412 8444 if you have not yet registered a session time.

We appreciate your flexibility and look forward to coming together for the Sacrament of Reconciliation.





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
