Dear members of the Lisieux community,

Welcome to Term 3! A very special welcome to new students and their families: Tom (3/4 Spotted Eucalypt Bleu) and Sadie Derbyshire (5/6 Ubuntu Bleu) and Ollie (1/2 Acacia Bleu) and Lucy Symes (3/4 Spotted Eucalypt Blanc).

On Monday this week, all our staff gathered for a day of professional learning and planning. We began with a beautiful Naidoc Week prayer and reflection, based on this year's theme, 'Heal Country!' As a staff team, we reflected on the successes of Semester One, key amongst these being Friday Flow, our Outdoor Learning initiatives and conference, and programs such as Beach Discovery, Sports Academy and Atelier. Of interest to us as a staff was that the most commonly celebrated achievements all involved community engagement, cross-age interaction and a relationship focus. In our first 3 ½ years as a learning community, we have consistently articulated that these areas are central to our mission. We have repeated our mantra that 'when we take care of wellbeing, we create the best conditions for learning.' It was affirming that other areas of whole school success included our intervention programs, spelling programs, and general academic growth.

Another key focus of our day, as well as planning for Term 3 curriculum, was re-visiting our 'why'. Simon Sinek is a motivational speaker who refers to the most successful institutions and organisations being driven by their 'why' rather than their 'how' or 'what'. In simple terms, our 'why' is the purpose that drives us and to know our 'why' provides direction in life and confidence in making decisions. One hundred odd years ago, the 'why' of schools was to prepare children for the workforce; now it is much more complex and our purpose is deeper. Our staff discussed the key drivers for our 'why' at Lisieux: wanting to create the conditions for our students to develop as fully formed individuals, to be curious and creative problem solvers with a sense of passion and justice for their world, to flourish with qualities of character that will enable them to make the world a better place. We had a very productive day as a staff team, and feel energised about the opportunities for learning that lie ahead this term.

Next Wednesday we will be holding Learning Conferences for all students and their families. Having received your child's report in the last week of Term Two, this is an opportunity to discuss academic and social progress and growth, share each child's strengths and needs and have dialogue about what will enable your child to do well in school this semester. We have decided to maintain these conferences as zoom meetings as this allows both parents to participate, where relevant, and avoids families having to organise childcare. In these uncertain times, it also reduces the need to have so many people on site, wearing masks and signing in, etc. Details of how to book will be emailed to all families today. We encourage your child to participate in the online conversation where possible as well. Please note that students will be dismissed at 1pm to allow the conferences to commence at 1:30pm. The Kelly Club will be available for families requiring supervision.




