



Dear members of the Lisieux community,

From time to time you may hear your child tell you that they have been involved in a restorative conversation at school. In line with our Positive Education approach at Lisieux, this is a process we utilise to restore right relationships and bring about healing after some hurt or harm has been done to another or others. Central to this approach is the understanding that conflict is a normal and natural part of our human interaction – it is how we deal with it that determines if the conflict will be carried as a hurt or if we can use it for growth and an opportunity for new understanding. Restorative practice has, at its heart, the key Gospel values of reconciliation, responsibility, reintegration and resolution of conflict. When supported by a trained adult, it allows individuals to work through what happened and seek positive outcomes. It is not appropriate to use where there is evidence of bullying, however, it has many positive applications in our school setting. At Lisieux, we are strongly committed to a strong wellbeing foundation underpinning all the work we do. We know that this is integral to the health and happiness of all in our learning community. A Restorative Practice approach is part of a broader commitment that acknowledges that learning will only take place where individuals feel 'known and loved', safe, connected and comfortable.

Bring your hope to hearts that feel defeated.


Bring your love and compassion to those in pain.

Parents / carers will recall that our scheduled student free day on 13 August was postponed. I would just like to clarify some questions that have been asked this last week.

Dress code

Your child is required to wear neat casual dress for their First Eucharist celebration.

Stole

When your child was baptised they wore a white garment as part of this Sacrament. This year your child will wear a white stole that they wore for Reconciliation, adding a symbol of Eucharist. If you are new to the school and require a stole it can be purchased from gracious glyphs (www.graciousglyphs.com.au)who you can purchase stoles from. They can customise the stoles for you or you can just purchase the stole and decorate yourself. The same stole can be used for all celebrations.

If you are just ordering the symbol of Eucharist, contact Gracious Glymphs, I have arranged with them that families just have to drop off the stole at school. I will take the stoles to them and they will attach the symbols. If you are going with this option, the stole needs to be at the office by **Friday 20th August.** They will be returned the following week.

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


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
