Each year around this time, we begin to make plans and decisions for the year ahead and what it will look like at our school. There are always multiple factors to consider, and at the centre of all our decision-making is what is ultimately best for our students. We work through a consultative process with staff to discuss issues such as class configurations, staffing allocations, and so on.

The following class configurations have been confirmed for 2023:

Prep: 3 x classes based in The Carmel Centre (approximately 15-18 students per class)

Year 1: 3 x classes (approximately 17-18 per class)

Year 2: 2 x classes (approximately 25 per class)

Year 3/4: 5 x classes (approximately 21 per class)

Year 5/6: 3 x classes (approximately 21 per class)

For 2023, we have decided to maintain a mix of both straight and composite classes. In Year 3-6, composite classes will provide us with more flexibility and options to ensure even class sizes and a balance of student social and academic needs.

It is the nature of schools that they constantly change and develop and this involves the addition and loss of staff from time to time. Next term we will welcome Georgia Martin back from maternity leave. Georgia will be with us on Wednesdays and Thursdays for the remainder of the year, and her role in Term 4 will be in literacy and numeracy intervention and enrichment. I would also like to advise the community that three of our current staff members will be undertaking adventures or new opportunities in 2023 and we wish them every success and happiness. **Miss Brienca Dries** will take a year's leave from Lisieux to travel around Australia and **Miss Laura Gillett** has been appointed to a teaching position at Iona College. We wish both Laura and Brie all the very best in these endeavours. We are also thrilled to announce that **Mr Matthew Curry** has been appointed Co-Deputy Principal at Holy Spirit Catholic Primary, Manifold Heights, to commence next year. Matt has been a valued member of our Lisieux staff for several years, and he has demonstrated a strong commitment to the wellbeing of all in our school community. This is a well-deserved appointment, and although we will miss Matt greatly, we know he will bring great expertise and commitment to his new role. We wish Matt all the very best, and will have opportunities in due course to farewell departing staff.



Family Mass



Hope to see you all there!






















































ST JOSEPH'S COLLEGE GEELONG YEAR 7 2023 ENROLMENT






