It was wonderful to welcome families to our oval on Friday evening for a picnic, after multiple failed events in recent years. The weather was perfect and there was a fantastic spirit amongst the crowd. We are grateful to The Kelly Club for facilitating some fun games on the night. A big thank you to those who came along, and for those who couldn't make it this time, there will be further community occasions throughout the year where we hope to see you and where you will be most welcome.



Over the last two weeks, students in Year 3 and 5 have been completing NAPLAN assessments. They have demonstrated perseverance, commitment and a growth mindset as they have completed these tasks, which are quite different in design to our usual learning style. As we remind children every year, these tests provide ONE source of data for us and a snapshot of individual learners at a given point in time. The tests do not tell us about a student's character strengths, such as leadership or kindness; they do not give evidence of a student's engagement or creativity - they only tell us 'part of the story', and while this is valuable, it is not a complete assessment of learning or growth.

At Lisieux, we have decided to evaluate wellbeing at the same time of year that we collect NAPLAN data. This is a very conscious decision. We want to know, in addition to how students are travelling with numeracy and literacy, how they are doing socially and emotionally. We want to know if they feel safe and connected at school, if they are engaging positively in tasks and if coming to school has meaning for them. Over the next week, Year 3 and 5 students will be completing a detailed wellbeing survey. As it is confidential, it will provide overall cohort data rather than student-specific data, and we look forward to sharing this with our community in due course. Other year levels will also complete the survey during Term One or Term Two.

This week on Tuesday evening, many of our wonderful Year 3 students (and a couple of older students as well) celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a special part of our Catholic faith journey and students have been preparing for this since early in the term. Through various gospel stories, they have explored the concepts of forgiveness and love and responsibility. In learning about the Sacrament of Reconciliation, they have learned more about self-reflection, understanding the power of our words and actions, asking for forgiveness and saying sorry. The sacramental celebrations were a beautiful culmination of the students' learning in class over recent weeks. We congratulate them on this special step in their faith journey.

Project Compassion

Priscilla's story

Zimbabwe

Climate change continues to bring unprecedented challenges for people living in the most vulnerable and remote communities in Zimbabwe. With the support of Caritas Hwange, Priscilla learnt conservation farming skills to grow droughtresistant crops and started poultry farming to support her family during the current food crisis.

Priscilla lives in the Hwange district in Zimbabwe with her husband, Charles, and her two grandsons. In Hwange, the impacts of climate change are exacerbating food insecurity in vulnerable communities. This can be seen in the erratic rainfall patterns, prolonged dry spells, poor agricultural soils and high temperatures in the region.

"We had plenty of rains at first but as time has gone by, the rains have become erratic and hence the yields have been reduced," Priscilla said.



Priscilla joined the Zimbabwe Integrated Community Development Program, implemented by our partner Caritas Hwange and funded by Caritas Australia. Through the program, Priscilla and her community learnt conservation farming techniques to grow drought-resistant crops to help mitigate the effects of climate change.

Priscilla was able to produce a bumper harvest in her first year of practicing in conservation farming. Priscilla also used the funds from her harvest to start poultry farming, where she can sell eggs to pay for her grandchildren's school fees, books and stationery. The poultry farming provides a safety net for Priscilla and her family during times of hardship, like the current drought.

In addition to conservation farming training, thanks to generous supporters like you, Caritas Hwange has helped Priscilla boost her food security through a range of activities, including participating in a community nutrition garden to grow and sell vegetables, and rehabilitating the dip tanks to keep her cows healthy and reduce the prevalence of tick-borne diseases. Caritas Hwange also rehabilitated a community dam near Priscilla's house, so cattle can have access to water all year.

While the situation in Zimbabwe and across eastern Africa remains dire, the work of Caritas Hwange means that Priscilla can learn the techniques, tools and resources she needs to build resilience and support her family during this current food crisis.

"We are indeed grateful to Caritas Hwange for the knowledge," Priscilla said. "Today we have knowledge and skills that we didn't have before and are able to use to earn a living."

- 4. Did you catch anyone doing something funny?
- 5. What did you like best about your day today?
- 6. Was there anything that happened today that made you feel bad?
- 7. What was the most interesting thing that you learned in school today?
- 8. Did you do anything different or new today?
- 9. What was the most difficult thing you did today?
- 10. What made you feel proud of yourself today?

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

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
