Smile at it and it will smile back.


Look at the animals and smile at them, they will smile back.

# Change to end of year date:

Families will be aware that the pre-advised end of year date for students is noted in the calendar as Friday 15 December. We make every effort not to change advertised dates and to give families plenty of notice for school closure days. Due to OHS regulations, it is a requirement that all our staff update their CPR training before the end of the year. We have liaised with the Advisory Council to seek support of the idea that students will conclude one day earlier, at 12:30pm on Thursday 14 December, allowing time for all staff to undergo relevant training. The Advisory Council has ratified this decision.

Accordingly, please note the revised end of year date for students will now be 12:30pm on Thursday 14 December. The Kelly Club will be available for supervision of those students who require this on Thursday afternoon and Friday.

Thanks to the parents who are showing respect for our new signage in the Kiss and Drop zone. The introduction of these signs has really helped to ensure the safe flow of traffic in the afternoons. Quite simply, we ask that you don't pull into this zone unless your child is ready and waiting for pick up. It is a no standing zone. Thanks to those parents who are either arriving earlier and parking or waiting until a little later and driving straight into the pick up zone if/when your child is ready and waiting. We ask that you DO NOT park in the staff carpark. This is dangerous as bikes and pedestrians may be walking through this area in the peak times. Thanks again for your understanding and support.



# Five reasons why creativity is important for kids

The development of children's brains is very important and creativity plays an essential role in this. Here are five reasons why creativity is so vital for children.

#### 1. Create self-confidence

Making something with your own hands will enhance your self-confidence. As a child, when you see someone reacting in a positive way to something you have made, it gives you a very satisfying feeling, it makes you proud. If you take the time to frame children's work and hang it up in a prominent place, it shows them that their work has value and is appreciated.

### 2. Problem solving abilities

Kids that draw and paint with enthusiasm often get spontaneous ideas. As they work on their project they learn how to make choices and combinations. They learn how to make solutions for problems. They learn skills like 'thinking out of the box' and self-reliance.

#### 3. Improving fine motor skills

By drawing and painting with different sorts of materials, children improve their fine motor skills. A child that has learnt how to hold a pencil at a young age will develop his or her fine motor skills more quickly. By practising skills like cutting, tearing, moulding clay etc, fine motor skills are developed from an early age. These are skills that are also useful in everyday life, like eating with knife and fork, tying shoe laces and writing.

#### 4. Concentration and focus

Children develop and learn how to concentrate and focus. When children work in a calm and peaceful environment they can focus on the task at hand. The more often they practice working like this, the longer they will be able to concentrate. It will help and train them to focus for longer periods of time.

#### 5. **Fun**

But most of all the fun and pleasure they have drawing and painting is important. Children are expected to perform well in society and this can be stressful. Self-expression, experimenting and making mistakes! That is how children learn and discover. Being a child makes us all happy.

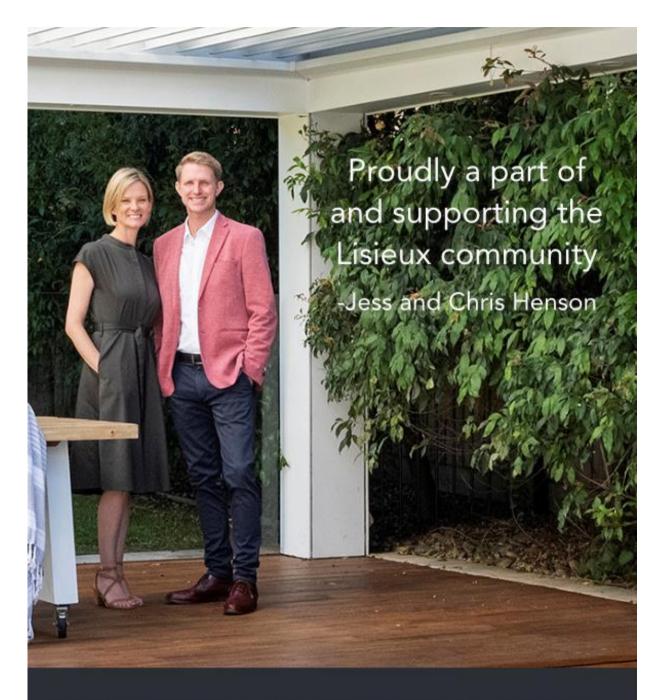
