A World Where Boys and Girls Grow Up as Equals

Surf Coast Shire is proud to participate in this year's 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence campaign in Victoria. The 16 Days of Activism will begin on 25 November and end on Sunday 10 December, which marks the global Human Rights Day.

We can all face unfair assumptions and treatment based on gender. Ideas and beliefs about gender limit us, drive this harm, and can lead to violence against women. What we read can help us challenge our attitudes and create a future where we are all safe, equal and respected.

This 16 Days of Activism and beyond, let's change the story and create a future where we are all safe, equal and respected.

Lisieux are the lucky recipients of a book pack funded by Respect Victoria in partnership with Surf Coast Shire Council. The Let's Change the Story book pack contains 22 books themed around gender equality. This initiative aims to subtly engage and educate primary school-aged children about the importance of gender equality through heart-warming storytelling and beautiful illustrations.














Lisieux Wine Fundraiser

Wed 13 Dec: Voucher lucky dip.


Thurs 14 Dec: Each staff member will take home a box of chocolates.
