STUDENT LEARNING & ACHIEVEMENTS

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Literacy

This term we have focused on learning how to build a complete sentence using the Colourful Semantics approach of identifying nouns (who), verb (what doing), what (common nouns) and what like (adjectives). We have enjoyed listening and sharing ideas during our Discovery time and using these ideas to spark our own writing ideas.

Maths

In Term I, we have been learning to record data using tally marks and have been learning to partition 2 digit numbers into tens and ones. We have also begun to use bar models to help us understand that we can add 2 parts together to make a whole.

We have spent a lot of time working on learning how we learn, what our strengths are, setting up our class routines and discovering how to regulate our bodies when we feel different feelings.











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Term 1 Sport

What a huge start to the year it has been for our students in the world of sport. Our 5/6 students have been especially busy with District Girls Football and Summer Lightning Premiership both being huge successes this term.




