Dear members of the Lisieux community,

Lunchtime routines changes

We've had such a positive response from both students and parents about our change to recess and lunch time eating routines. School review year

Every four years, primary schools in Victoria must go through a review process. The process has two dimensions: improvement and compliance. The process takes place over the year, including self-assessment and reflection, liaison with a school reviewer, and a dialogue and engagement session for feedback, commendations and recommendations. There is a lot of work involved in the process and we look forward to the collation of data which will help us ensure best practice.

Transition and Wellbeing Discussions

Next week on both Tuesday and Wednesday between 2pm-4:30pm, we are holding Transition and Wellbeing discussions. These will take place in the Multi Purpose Area with your child's teachers. These conversations are a valuable opportunity to discuss your child's wellbeing needs, share essential information, set goals for the future, and address any concerns early on. Working together with teachers creates a strong support system for your child's success, both academically and personally, helping them thrive in their learning journey. Mobile Phones/Smart Watches Reminder

This is a reminder that students are discouraged from bringing smart watches or mobile phones to school. If you deem it necessary for your child to have a mobile phone or Smart Watch, please remember it is school policy that all mobile phones and Smart Watches must be handed in at the office as soon as the child arrives at school, and collected at the end the day. This ensures that mobile phones and watches are not used inappropriately, they are not a distraction and they are not misplaced. Please note that this is our expectation regardless of whether the device is set to school mode or not.

Guidelines for screen time can be found in the Australian [24-hour movement guidelines](#) for the early years. These guidelines were developed from reviews of the evidence about the effects of physical activity, sleep and sedentary time (including screen time) on children's development, health and wellbeing.

For screen time, the guidelines recommend:

- no screen time for children younger than two years
- no more than one hour per day for children aged 2–5 years
- no more than two hours of sedentary recreational screen time per day for children and young people aged 5–17 years (not including schoolwork).

Dear parents and carers

Re: \$400 School Saving Bonus

Families want the absolute best for their kids. But with the current cost of living – uniforms, camps, sports and more – it all adds up.

That's why the Allan Labor Government is making life that little bit easier for families, by providing a one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

Non-government school students who will be in Prep through to Year 12 in 2025, and who are receiving the means-tested [Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund](#) (CSEF), are eligible for the School Saving Bonus.

Parents and carers do not need to apply, with the School Saving Bonus being paid to non-government schools for eligible students from late November 2024.

The \$400 School Saving Bonus is available for each child. That means an eligible family with three school-aged children will receive a total of \$1,200.


Importantly, the School Saving Bonus is available in addition to the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund.

To learn more about the School Saving Bonus, talk to your school about how this cost of living relief will apply to you.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$154 for primary school students
- \$256 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments:** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one; or
- on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder; or
- b) Be a temporary foster parent; and
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: [Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund \(CSEF\): Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au](https://www.education.vic.gov.au/csef/eligibility)

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students' attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink (see [Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund \(CSEF\): Policy | education.vic.gov.au](https://www.education.vic.gov.au/csef/policy)).

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

The CSEF is paid directly to the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child. Please refer to the policy for the current rates.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: [Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund \(CSEF\): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au](https://www.education.vic.gov.au/csef/payment-amounts)

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.

A RECAP OF PBL

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING (PBL) IS A COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH THAT EMPHASISES THE CULTIVATION OF POSITIVE BEHAVIOURS AMONG STUDENTS, CREATING AN ATMOSPHERE WHERE LEARNING CAN THRIVE. IT CHANGES THE FOCUS FROM TRADITIONAL DISCIPLINARY MEASURES TO FOCUS ON REINFORCING DESIRABLE BEHAVIOURS, FOSTERING A SUPPORTIVE AND ENGAGING LEARNING ENVIRONMENT.

PBL ENCOMPASSES STRATEGIES THAT PROMOTE A POSITIVE SCHOOL CULTURE, EMPHASISING RESPECT, RESPONSIBILITY, AND COOPERATION. IT INVOLVES TEACHING AND REINFORCING BEHAVIOURAL EXPECTATIONS, ACKNOWLEDGING AND REINFORCING POSITIVE ACTIONS, AND PROVIDING SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS WHO MAY FACE CHALLENGES IN MEETING THESE EXPECTATIONS.

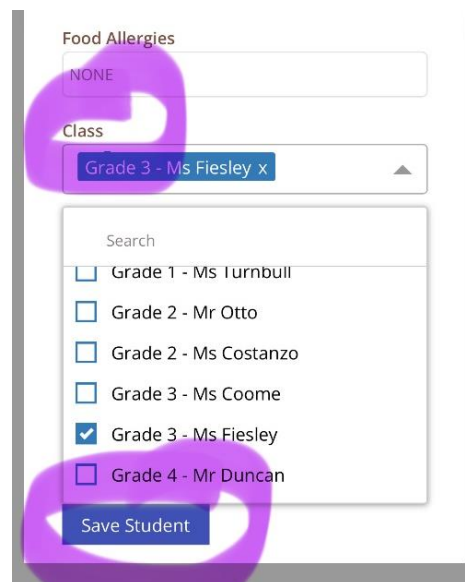
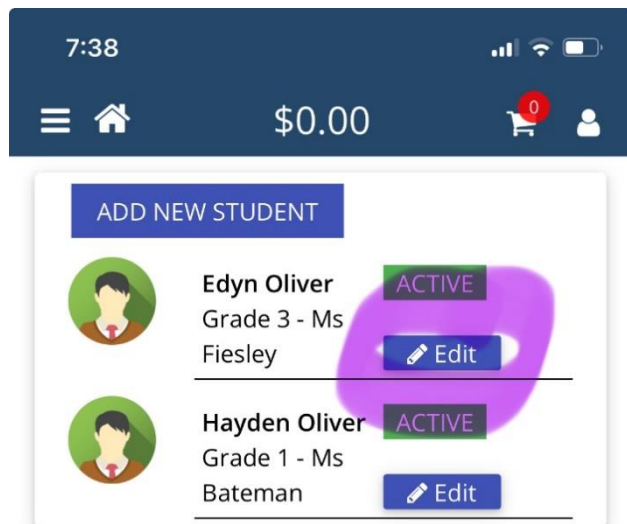
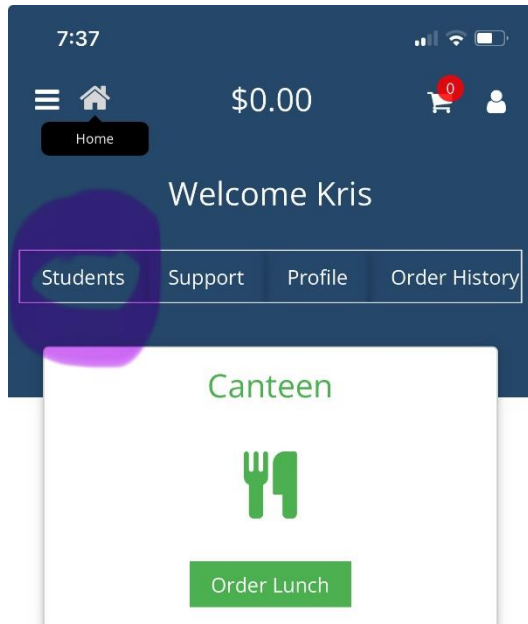
Friday Canteen
