### **2025** Geelong Pilgrimage

Yesterday our Year 6 Social Justice Leaders, accompanied by myself and Miss Rhiannon Evans, took part in the inaugural Geelong Catholic Primary Schools' Pilgrimage of Hope, as part of Catholic Education Week. Representatives from each of the 20 Catholic primary schools proudly paraded through the streets of Geelong, visiting significant Catholic landmarks in the area. We began at The Chapel of Remembrance in Eastern Cemetery, walked to the old Geelong Gaol, which has a special connection to the story of Catholic education in Geelong, walked on to St Mary's Hall and the former St Mary's school in Malop Street, and celebrated mass together at St Mary's Basilica. We ended with a shared lunch at St Mary's Sporting Club, where guest speaker Julia Roach spoke to the students about Our Village (formerly Geelong Mums) about the work of this organisation. Together, we celebrated the positive impact of Catholic education on Geelong and joined our Catholic leaders in this Jubilee year of hope.




### **Lisieux Advisory Council**

As part of Catholic Education Week the students from the region's Catholic schools participated in "A Pilgrimage of Unity and Discovery" Our Social Justice Leaders represented Lisieux, here are some of their reflections from the day.

On Wednesday the nineteenth of March the Social Justice Leaders went to the Eastern Cemetery. We participated in a smoking ceremony as well as a Welcome to County. While we were there we also saw some significant sites like the part of the cemetery where some priests and sisters had been buried. Eastern Cemetery also had a chapel. (Allira Hardiman)

When we finished up at the cemetery we went to the Old Geelong Gaol or Orphanage and had a snack there. While we were eating snacks we were told the history of the building. They told us how strict the laws were back then. If you were found on the streets as a child you would be arrested and that's where the orphanage kicked in because if you were a child you would be in the orphanage. Children in the orphanage began to receive an education thanks to Father Stephens. (Thomas Wilson)

We walked on to the old St Mary's hall. There were lots and lots of Catholic Primary Schools that were there. St Mary's hall was opened in 1892 and became a school for girls and infant boys. It was taught by lay teachers (teachers who were not nuns or priests). Eventually the number of students grew too big for the Hall and a two roomed brick school was built in 1907. (Jackson Takle)



We arrived at the massive church, St Mary's Basilica, walking in I felt how small I am compared. As I walked down the aisle Mrs Ryan gestured us to sit down in the 4th row seat patiently awaiting the other staff and social justice leaders from 20 different schools.

Father Jude came in beginning the mass, we started off with the acknowledgment of the traditional custodians of the land after that Father Jude said how the 2024 word of the year was 'Brain Rot" and we had a little chat about that, he then said do you know what the church as chosen for the 2025 word of the year? The room remained silent thinking about it. The word is hope and that is what you are doing today he explained, Exploring the importance of hope and how it is different to other things.

After mass Thomas W received a candle to remember the day by, this candle can be seen on our school prayer table at the front office. (Sebastian Costa)



We walked from the Mary's basilica to St Mary's footy club and we were greeted with all sorts of food like sandwiches, sausage rolls and party pies. After we ate, one of the "Our Village" members, formally known as Geelong Mums came in and talked to us about some of their history. It was very interesting learning about the "Our Village history. Afterwards we left St Mary's footy club. On our way out there were slices waiting for us such as brownie slices and passion fruit. 
### **Friday Canteen**
